John 6.51-58

⁵¹I am the living bread that came
down from heaven. Whoever eats
of this bread will live for ever; and
the bread that I will give for the life
of the world is my flesh.'

⁵² The Jews then disputed among
themselves, saying, 'How can this
man give us his flesh to eat?' ⁵³So
Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell
you, unless you eat the flesh of the
Son of Man and drink his blood,
you have no life in you. ⁵⁴Those
who eat my flesh and drink my
blood have eternal life, and I will
raise them up on the last day; ⁵⁵for
my flesh is true food and my blood
is true drink. ⁵⁶Those who eat my
flesh and drink my blood abide in
me, and I in them. ⁵⁷Just as the
living Father sent me, and I live
because of the Father, so whoever
eats me will live because of
me. ⁵⁸This is the bread that came
down from heaven, not like that
which your ancestors ate, and they
died. But the one who eats this
bread will live for ever.'
